1) Watch for DNA Sales at Ancestry.com, MyHeritage, 23andMe and FamilyTreeDNA. There are DNA Discount Sales for Thanksgiving and Christmas. For example, MyHeritageDNA is \$39 – see <u>Early Black Friday Sale on MyHeritage DNA</u> - \$39 (retail is \$79, expires 16 November. <u>AncestryDNA test is \$59</u> (retail is \$99, expires 23 November). <u>23andMe Ancestry +</u> <u>Traits is \$79</u> (retail is \$99, expires 23 November). FamilyTreeDNA Family Finder test is \$79 (retail \$99, expires 20 November).

Included is a link to Jonny Perl's latest improvement to the Shared DNA cM Tool – see <u>The Shared cM Project 4.0 tool v4 with option to add a second amount</u>. Now you can add the shared cM values for a second person you match with (say a sibling, niece/nephew, first cousin, etc.) to reduce the number of relationships that your shared match is to you and your second person. Generally, the greater the difference between the two siblings or cousins, the more valuable the tool will be.

1) Finished reading *The Sawtooth Slayer* book. The forensic genealogist team can use only FamilyTreeDNA and GEDmatch to solve criminal or missing persons cases due to privacy concerns. Useful websites to find living people, including newspaper articles, people finders, family trees, etc. The team's process of taking a subject's DNA Match and finding common ancestors with other DNA matches of the subject, creating family trees of the other DNA matches, and then doing descendant research to find identity of the subject match is described.

2) AncestryDNA now has 41,277 DNA matches for me. I added Notes to some of them. MyHeritageDNA now has 10,839 DNA matches for me. Reviewed the new DNA matches on AncestryDNA, MyHeritageDNA, FamilyTreeDNA and 23andMe.
