C) Randy's Work

- 1) My grandson Logan is 16, a junior in high school, and had an interview assignment as part of his social studies class on the topic of "My Family's Emigration." He chose me to be interviewed about one of his immigrant ancestors, with ten questions. I chose his 2nd great-grandfather, Leone Giovanni Morandi (1894-1979) who was born in Bagni di Lucca in England, came to the U.S. in 1926 and settled in Salt Lake City, and then in Petaluma, California. I wrote about it in Rabbit Holes With Randy -- Helping My Grandson With an Immigration Interview.
- 2) Added two Six Generation Descendants Reports for 4th great-grandparents Simon Wade and Phebe Horton, and Humphrey White and Sibel Kirby, to my blog; I have done 12 of these to date using the RootsMagic family tree program. These are cousin bait for genealogy and DNA if someone Googles a name in these reports, they will find what I know about their birth, marriages, death, spouse and children. By doing this for five generations, it may help with Common Ancestors and Thrulines in AncestryDNA.
- 3) My daughter gifted me StoryWorth for Christmas. StoryWorth is a subscription site (\$99 for a year) that provides story ideas once a week, encourages you to write family stories, and share them with your family in email, with a book option (\$\$) at the end of the year. I've written 17 stories so far in 7 weeks mainly from stories I've told on my blog. I wrote about it in Rabbit Holes With Randy Telling Family Stories in Storyworth.
